

White Wine by the bottle

- 1 ***Finca Los Prados Chenin Semillon 2009*** £15.95
£4.95 by the glass

Argentina

Light, youthful colour and a fresh, lemony perfume on the nose. Clean and fresh, it is well balanced with the Semillon adding a smooth, almost waxy character to the fresh, zingy style of the Chenin Blanc. Good length and a clean finish.

- 2 ***Cortegiara Pinot Grigio 2009*** £17.95
£4.95 by the glass

Made by the famous Allegrini family, Cortegiara is the negotiant side of the business. Bright straw yellow in colour with green notes of the vine sweetened by acacia flowers. A dry, fresh and harmonious wine.

- 3 ***Vinedos de la Posada Organic Fairtrade Torrontes 2009*** £18.50
£4.95 by the glass

Argentina

From one of the best Fairtrade wineries in the world according to Jancis Robinson, this is a wonderfully aromatic and perfumed wine with delicate floral notes. Intense citrus fruit flavours on the palate combine with spicy overtones to produce a rich complex wine with bright acidity. A fabulous partner for Asian dishes but is also the perfect aperitif.

- 4 ***Gran Sasso Trebbiano d'Abruzzo 2008*** £18.50
£5.95 by the glass

Italy

Trebbiano can be seriously boring! This is a lovely example. Fresh citrus on the nose with ripe melon and hints of sherbet. It's really zesty and tangy on the palate. Zesty citrus with grape, stone fruit and ripe red apple.

- 5 ***Sauvignon Vignerons de Valancay Vin de Pays 2009*** £18.95

Loire, France

Made by talented winemaker Sebastian Vaillant this is pure Sauvignon Blanc and is not unsurprisingly Sancerre- esque in style. This wine is clean, modern and very fresh with a hint of gunflint adding complexity to the citrus and subtle gooseberry leaf fruit.

- 6 ***Wapara Springs Sauvignon Blanc 2008*** £19.95

New Zealand

Fresh from winning the top two prizes at the Christchurch First Taste Awards, Waipara Springs Sauvignon will come as a revelation to your tastebuds. Beautifully well balanced with an aromatic nose of crushed nettles, cut grass, gooseberries, grapefruit and ripe lemons. The lingering mineral laced clean dry finish just goes on and on.

- 7 ***Domaine Cheval Blanc Signe Bordeaux Blanc 2008*** £19.50

Bordeaux, France

Classic Bordeaux blend of Sauvignon Blanc, Semillon and a little of the highly aromatic Muscadelle. Un-wooded pure and fruit driven, this superb hand crafted wine won a Gold Medal at the Concours General in Paris earlier this year.

- 8 ***Paul Cluver Gewurztraminer 2009*** £23.95

Elgin, South Africa

When we harvested the grapes, the aroma of crushed litchi and litchi juice filled the winery. This is one of our most expressive Gewurztraminers to date. It is bursting with flavours of rose water, Turkish delight and of course, litchi! The palate is rich, lingering with hints of spice. A truly great and balanced wine.

- 9 ***Pieropan Soave 2008*** £26.95

Veneto, Italy

Pieropan's Soave is just that wine. Made from 85% Garganega and 15% Trebbiano di Soave (the latter is part of Pieropan's effort to safeguard ancient native Italian varieties that have lately been neglected by most growers) the wine is brilliant straw yellow with greenish hues. It has an ample but delicate nose of almond, mineral and white florals. Elegant with medium body, it leads with flavours of honeydew melon, green apple, pear and almonds on the palate; tempered with good acidity and silky texture, it leaves a pleasingly bitter finish.

- 10 ***Domaine Sautereau Sancerre 2007*** £32.95

Loire, France

Crafted from fruit grown on David Sautereau's vineyards in Crezany, Bue and Sancerre, this well balanced wine has a lovely touch of minerality on the palate that combines with the aromatic gooseberry character on the nose. An elegant style of Sancerre from a modern family owned estate.

- 11 ***Paco & Lola Albarino 2008*** £33.95

Rias Baixas, Spain

Delicious Albarino from Galicia in north western Spain. Aromatic and quite Viognier like Albarino is consumed in copious quantities in the seafood restaurants of Spain. This example has an expressive nose, good weight and complexity on the palate and a persistent finish. Just wait till you clap eyes on the funky label!

- 12 ***Patrick Puize Chablis Terroirs de Chablis 2008*** £35.50

Burgundy, France

This is a-typical Chablis at its best. It has a wonderful flinty aroma combined with good depth of pure ripe fruit on the palate balanced by a mineral laced lingering finish. A steely dry, nervy Chablis from a highly talented winemaker.

Red Wine by the bottle

- 13 Finca Los Prados Cabernet Malbec 2009** £15.95
£4.95 by the glass
Argentina
Good depth of colour and attractive dark berry fruit on the nose. On the palate the wine is full bodied while still retaining a youthful freshness. The Malbec adds a licquorice and tobacco character to the forward, cassis style of the Cabernet.
- 14 Mirador Rioja Tinto 2008** £17.50
£4.95 by the glass
Rioja, Spain
Antonio's winery is situated in the sleepy little town of Navarette near Legrono in La Rioja Alta. Old vines make for deep, dark wines and the high altitude gives a natural freshness to the wine. Antonio adds a portion of his oak aged Crianza to add depth and a pleasing dash of creamy vanilla oak to this vibrantly fruity young wine.
- 15 Murphy's Shiraz 2006** £17.95
£4.95 by the glass
New South Wales, Australia
The label depicts the sand dunes and blue sky synonymous with the Willandra vineyard. A big juicy fresh flavoured Shiraz, plum, raspberry and gentle spice flavours all combines to make this an excellent wine.
- 16 Vinedos de la Posada Organic Fairtrade Merlot 2009** £18.50
£5.95 by the glass
Argentina
This Merlot has an intense aroma and is full of plum and cherry, as well as hints of hazelnut. This is a full bodied wine, which is both elegant and well balanced.
- 17 Fournier Urban Malbec 2008** £18.95
Argentina
The nose gives bright fresh blackberry aromas which leap from the glass and a delicate floral note reminiscent of violets. On the palate, the dominant flavours are of ripe redcurrants overlaid with some darker more concentrated black fruits. The finish is long and balanced."
- 18 Poggiotondo Cerro del Masso Chianti 2008** £19.95
Tuscany, Italy
This mouth watering easy to drink wine creates character by combining mature Sangiovese grapes (the main variety of grape used to make this wine) with fresh Mediterranean qualities of the Poggiotondo region. A remarkably distinguished wine.
- 19 Domaine Cheval Blanc Signe Rouge 2008** £19.95
Bordeaux, France
A classic Bordeaux blend of Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. Soft, fleshy and generously fruity with good structure, this lovely wine won a Silver Medal at the Bordeaux Concours du Vins de Aquitaine earlier this year.
- 20 Tour de Montmelas Beaujolais Village 2008** £22.50
Burgundy, France
Ripe, intense and gutsy, packed with intense strawberry fruit all wrapped up in a muscular structure – ask for it chilled or cellar temperature.
- 21 Allegrini Valpolicella Classico 2008/09** £23.50
Fumane, Italy
Franco Allegrini stands head and shoulders above all other growers in Valpolicella, an ultra modernist who believes in freshness and purity of flavour, his wines are quite unlike any others from the area. This Valpolicella is a case in point dark, attractively scented of black cherries and with a lingering finish.
- 22 Gran Sasso Montepulciano d'Abruzzo 2008** £23.95
Italy
This wine is deep ruby red in colour with garnet reflections. It is clean, fresh and plummy on the nose, rich, supple and accessible on the palate. It is balanced and full-bodied with good tannins. The fresh primary fruit characters are maximised by the fact that it does not age in oak, making it approachable and ready to drink.
- 23 Paul Cluver Pinot Noir 2008** £30.95
Elgin, South Africa
Paul Cluver Elgin Pinot Noir has an excellent colour, this wine's expressive wild berry on the nose is complemented by hints of chocolate, violet and coffee aromas. The complex palate overflows with lingering sweet berry flavours; its finish is typically velvety.
- 24 Chateau La Lagune Mademoiselle L 2006** £41.50
Bordeaux, France
Chateau La Lagune is a 3eme Grand Cru Classe from the Haut Medoc, renowned for its traditional style. Mademoiselle L is predominantly Cabernet Sauvignon with some Merlot, and a little Cabernet Franc. This gives a classic leafy character on the nose yet is ripe, fleshy and supple on the palate with an excellent lingering finish.
- 25 Domaine Mongeard-Mugneret Borgogne Hautes-Cotes Nuit 'La Croix' 2007** £44.95
Burgundy, France
Hautes-Cotes-de-Nuits wines have a notable purity which finds expression in their freshness and intense savour of red and black fruits: gooseberries, raspberries, blackcurrants. This is a top class example.

Rose Wine by the bottle

- 26 *Sabina Rose 2009* £15.95
Central Valley, Chile £4.95 by the glass

A lovely Merlot based rose from the Central Valley in Chile. Premium cool climate fruit makes for an off dry rounded Rose full of dried strawberry and cream flavours. Picador is lush and all too easy to drink.

- 27 *Slowine Rose 2009* £17.95
Elgin, South Africa

Bright salmon pink in colour, with the fragrance of ripe strawberries and black cherries in the background. Slowine is tasty, harmonious and invigorating with the sweetness and acidity in great balance for lingering pleasure.

- 28 *Sautereau Sancerre Rose 2008* £31.95
Loire, France

Made from pure Pinot Noir, this Rose offers the full gamut of Pinot flavours. David's wine has a refreshing, mid palate, loaded with aromas of raspberries and cherries, with a slight hint of rose petals.

Champagne by the bottle

- 29 *Montaudon Reserve Premiere Brut NV* £49.95

Champagne, France

This is quite simply one of the best non-vintage champagnes on the market. Rich and toasty with great finesse and elegance this is a wine that puts the wow factor back into Champagne.

- 30 *Montaudon Classe M Prestige Cuvee NV* £69.95

Champagne, France

This prestige cuvee is incredibly rich and creamy with a nutty, biscuity palate.

- 31 *Montaudon Vintage 2000* £89.95
Champagne, France

Delicate yellow gold in colour with a continuous stream of small bubbles. This Champagne has a remarkable visual appeal. Very expressive on the nose, a combination of crème fraiche, dried flowers and jam. Palate: First impressions confirm this Champagne has a strong personality. Rich and full flavoured this is a bold and well proportioned wine.

Dessert Wine by the bottle

- 32 *Paul Cluver Weisser Riesling Noble Late Harvest 2008* £26.50

Elgin, South Africa

Paul Cluver's sticky is packed with dried apricot, spice and honey character on the nose. The mouth feel is full and impressively rich but with superb balance. The aftertaste seems to linger forever.
